Featured Funder: Simons Foundation

The Simons Foundation has a history of providing sustained support for researchers committed to "unraveling the mysteries of the universe." We've featured the Simons Foundation in our October, 2018 issue and focused on the various institutes hosted by the foundation, like the Flatiron Institute that hosts in-house research operations and the Simons Autism Research Institute (SFARI). We also highlighted different grant opportunities in their four distinct target areas: Mathematics & Physical Sciences, Life Sciences, Autism & Neuroscience, and Science, Society & Culture. Grants offered in each category remain very specific and we have highlighted a unique opportunity in each distinct category below, as well as links to learn more about opportunities in each field:

- ⇒ Mathematics & Physical Sciences: Scientific Software Research Faculty Award, <u>deadline December</u> 8, 2023
- ⇒ <u>Life Sciences</u>: Simons Early Career Investigator in Aquatic Microbial Ecology and Evolution Awards, <u>deadline February 29, 2024</u>
- ⇒ <u>Autism and Neuroscience</u>: SFARI Supplement to Enhance Equity and Diversity (SEED) Request for Applications, *open now and rolling deadline*
- ⇒ <u>Science, Society & Culture</u>: Science Sandbox, *invitation only*

Many of the Simons foundations' grants encourage scientists from underrepresented backgrounds to apply and the foundation leads with the principle that science requires a diversity of perspectives. The Simons Foundation has since expanded the ways it promotes diversity in science by funding both research and storytelling initiatives that promote the foundations' values.

In addition to the invitation only Science, Society & Culture opportunity above, the <u>Sandbox Fund</u> also accepts unsolicited proposals. The program area "offers grants, mentorship, and other opportunities for independent artists seeking to explore the intrinsic link between science and culture through innovative storytelling. The program is administered by Sundance Institute Documentary Fund, in collaboration with Sandbox Films." Nonfiction documentaries at any stage of the production process are eligible for up to \$50,000. The Sandbox Fund prioritizes projects that highlight diversity in science and "specifically those that feature characters, topics, or disciplines that broaden and redefine what it means to be a scientist or to do science." The Fund offers grants bi-annually for Fall and Spring cycles, with decisions occurring generally in the winter and summer. The Spring 2024 cycle deadline is to be announced and deadlines are announced generally 5 months in advance.

Sage Advice: Navigating AI Generative Tools in the Classroom

This semester, I am teaching a graduate-level Sociology of Education course at New York University. After the first week of assignments, I gave students an opportunity to share advice for managing heavy reading weeks in the course for their peers still adjusting to the level of reading required for graduate school. This semester, far more tips involved the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI), particularly Large Language Models (LLMs) that mimic human intelligence like ChatGPT. It was clear that, to students, LLMs were simply a tool to help them feel more prepared for class. It was also clear that I had not outlined nearly enough guidelines regarding the use of AI on assignments in the course.

Inside Higher Ed published an article about the lack of policies and guidelines shared in faculty syllabi. The article references a 2023 Primary Research Group survey of instructors on views and use of the Al writing tools that stresses faculty desires for more guidance around Al policies and best practices for their classrooms. Luckily, Barnard's Center for Engaged Pedagogy (CEP) has tackled faculty-related questions head-on and offers resources for making decisions about Al and coursework. We've threaded together resources from CEP and other sources that can help you make informed decisions about Al in your classroom as well:

- ⇒ The CEP interviewed faculty across Barnard and gathered their different approaches to navigating AI in the classroom. This Integrating Generative AI in Teaching and Learning resource shares insights on how faculty have reimagined their course assignments and policies. There is also an opportunity on the page for you to submit how you have reimagined yours!
- ⇒ The CEP has compiled one of the most comprehensive <u>Generative AI and the College Classroom</u> resource pages that we have come across in higher education for syllabi statements, infographics for making decisions about AI, reference lists, and frequently asked questions.
- ⇒ <u>Classroom Policies for Generative Al Tools</u>, created by Lance Eaton, is an open-source archive of language and policies from higher education for Al-Generative tools in the classroom. For a more searchable resource, check out the <u>spreadsheet</u> version as well. We don't know Lance personally, but we find it helpful (and so does the CEP).
- ⇒ Columbia University Center for Teaching & Learning also has a helpful Considerations for Al Tools in the Classroom resource guide. It is a good resource for understanding the basics of Al Generative tools and classroom use.
- ⇒ The Digital Futures Institute at Teachers College hosted an Al in the Classroom Interview Series. The series ranges in topics from how to interact with Al in a meaningful way to racialized experiences employing Al tools.

As AI Generative Tools have been a hot topic in higher education, we plan to research guidelines and policies as they continue to evolve both on Barnard's campus and on broader, national scales. Stay tuned for future Sage Advice columns on AI in Higher Education. FROM THE NIH

Adjustments to NIH Policy for Subawards and Implementation

By NIH Staff, Posted September 20, 2023 "This summer, NIH announced planned changes to its policy on subawards—arrangements in which a grant recipient has another organization perform grant-supported research activities as part of the federal award. We previewed those plans in our June 21, 2023 article "Prepare for October Policy Changes on Subawards, Foreign Subrecipients."

As explained in a September 15, 2023 Guide notice, NIH has since altered certain aspects of By NIH Staff, Posted August 28, 2023 the planned policy changes and their implementation.

First, the policy changes will now go into effect on January 1, 2024, instead of October 1, 2023.

Second, NIH adjusted the stipulation enhancing grant recipient oversight of foreign subrecipients. Rather than a foreign subrecipient being required to provide copies of research materials at least every 3 months, foreign subrecipients will be required to provide access to copies of research materials no less than once per year. <<more>>
