Featured Funder: STEM-Focused Early Career Faculty Awards

Grant-seeking can often seem daunting to faculty just starting out, and many opportunities are more realistic for well-established academics. So this month's column is designed to provide you with information about a variety of STEM-focused early career faculty fellowships, including their eligibility requirements, application deadlines, and funding ranges. Early career faculty fellowships are a great way to support your research, teaching, conference travel, and professional development. Fellowships can also help you to network with other scholars and to build your reputation in your field. While opportunities like the <u>NSF CAREER</u> award is undoubtedly one of the most well-known early career faculty fellowships, this month's issue also highlights a variety of lesser-publicized but equally valuable opportunities:

- ⇒ National Science Foundation (NSF) Faculty Early Career Development (CAREER) Program [STEM broad]: The NSF CAREER program is one of the most prestigious (and competitive) awards in support of early-career faculty in the United States. It provides funding for five years to support research, education, and outreach activities that will build a foundation for a lifetime of leadership in these areas. Funding: a minimum of \$400,000 for the 5-year duration; Anticipated Deadline: July 24, 2024
- ⇒ National Institutes of Health (NIH) New Innovator Award [Biomedical sciences]: The NIH New Innovator Award supports early-stage investigators who propose highly innovative, high-risk, high-impact research projects that could have a major impact on biomedical science. Funding: \$1.5 million in direct costs split into two multi-year segments. Anticipated Deadline: August 2024
- ⇒ Sloan Research Fellowships [chemistry, physics, and mathematics]: The Alfred P. Sloan Foundation's Research Fellowships support early-career scientists and engineers who are pursuing fundamental research in chemistry, physics, and mathematics. Funding: \$75,000 for two years. Anticipated Deadline: September 15, 2024
- National Science Foundation (NSF) Collaborative Research in Computational and Information Science (CRII) Program [computational and information science]: The NSF CRII Program supports collaborative research projects in computational and information science that involve multiple institutions and researchers. Funding: \$175,000 for a period of 24 months. Anticipated Deadline: September 24, 2024
- ⇒ <u>Neuroscience Investigator Awards</u> [neuroscience]: The New York Stem Cell Foundation (NYSCF) Neuroscience Investigator Awards support early-career neuroscientists who are pursuing innovative research. Funding: up to \$1.5 million in flexible funding over 5 years. *Anticipated Deadline:* February 16, 2024
- ⇒ Fellowship Awards in the Neurosciences [neurosciences]: The Klingenstein-Simons Fellowship Awards in the Neurosciences program provides funding to support postdoctoral research in the neurosciences. Funding: \$300,000 over three years. Anticipated Deadline: February 15, 2024
- ⇒ Google's Research Scholar Program [computer science]: The Research Scholar Program aims to support early -career professors who are pursuing research in fields relevant to Google, including social science research that looks at technology's implications and impacts on individuals and society. Funding: up to \$60,000. Anticipated Deadline: Application opens November 3, 2023 and deadline is December 1, 2023

Sage Advice: Ethical Considerations for the Use of AI in Research

We're back for another issue of our "Sage Advice Series: AI in Higher Education." AI is being used to develop new research methods, transcribe interviews, analyze large datasets, communicate research findings during the writing stage, and even offer feedback during the peer-review process. However, the use of AI in research also raises a number of ethical and regulatory challenges. Luckily, several Institutional Review Boards (IRBs) across the US have developed a number of policies to guide the responsible and ethical use of AI in research to protect the rights and interests of human subjects in research. We've highlighted a few priorities for researchers to consider that have emerged from recent IRB policies:

- ⇒ Transparency: Researchers must disclose the use of AI in their research protocols and informed consent forms, so that participants can understand how their data will be used and make informed decisions about whether to participate. IRBs are not alone in the push for transparency among researchers; <u>some journals and academic presses require researchers to disclose the use of AI in their research.</u> For more information on transparency in informed consent, check out the University of Tennessee-Knoxville's guidance on AI in Research.
- ⇒ Fairness: Researchers must take steps to minimize the risk of bias in their AI systems, by using diverse datasets and auditing their systems for bias. This is particularly important for the data analysis phase. Check out the Harvard Business Review's thoughts on the role of <u>IRB and mitigating bias in AI research</u>.
- ⇒ Privacy: Researchers must protect the privacy of the data they are inputting into AI systems (as a consumer of the system) or using to develop AI systems (as an AI researcher and developer). This often means using anonymized data whenever possible, encrypting data, and limiting access to data. Again, IRBs are not alone in this priority; The National Institutes of Health (NIH) has also ruled the <u>use of AI in peer-review processes as a breach of confidentiality.</u> For more information on privacy considerations, check out the Department of Health and Human Services Secretary's Advisory Committee on Human Research Protections <u>considerations for IRB Review.</u>
- ⇒ Security: Researchers must take steps to secure their AI systems from unauthorized access and use, by using strong passwords, firewalls, and intrusion detection systems. It is important to research any recent security breaches the AI system you intend to use has experienced and what each company has done to mitigate future security failures. For more information on considerations for security when using AI in Research, check out the <u>University of California's most recent report</u>.

While AI has the potential to revolutionize the way that research is conducted, many IRBs recognize the importance of using AI in a responsible and ethical way. It is crucial for faculty to be aware of the IRB policies and trends at their institutions and partner institutions that are relevant to their research as both AI capabilities and IRB standards evolve.
